We value your support in working with us and hope that you will find this information useful.


ENGLISH

Your child will be:

- Exploring traditional tales from different parts of the world including, myths, legends and fables.
- Comparing different versions of traditional tales and their features.
- Writing their own traditional tales.
- Writing a set of instructions for making relief maps.
- Creating an information leaflet for an exhibition.



MATHEMATICS



Your child will be:

- Recognising that tenths arise from dividing an object into 10 equal parts and in dividing one - digit numbers or quantities by 10. (revisited)
- Adding and subtracting decimals.
- Revising all four operations.
- Using Singapore Bar to solve algebraic problems, including missing numbers.
- Solve problems, including missing number problems, involving multiplication and division, including positive integer scaling problems and correspondence problems in which n objects are connected to m objects.
- Draw and make 3-D shapes using modelling materials; recognise 3-D shapes in different orientations and describe them.
- Pupils' knowledge of the properties of shapes is extended at this stage to symmetrical and non-symmetrical polygons and polyhedra. Pupils extend their use of the properties of shapes. They should be able to describe the properties of 2-D and 3-D shapes using accurate language, including lengths of lines and acute and obtuse for angles greater or lesser than a right angle.

UNDERSTANDING THE WORLD



Your child will be:

- Locating European countries on a map.
- Comparing different European countries, by identifying human and physical characteristics and key topographical features.
- Using maps, atlases, globes and digital/computer mapping to locate countries and describe features studied.

COMPUTING



Your child will be:

- Learning about the issues of cyber bullying, how to recognise it, prevent it and keep safe online.
- Using Google Forms, Google Sheets and Google Slides.
- Collecting, analysing and presenting data.



PERSONAL, SOCIAL AND EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Your child will be:

- Learning how to make people they care about happy and speak about the important people in their lives.
- Able to make amends if they have done something they are not proud of.
- Able to say what I am good at and what is good about me.

PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT

Your child will be:

- Learning to run effectively at fast, medium and slow speeds.
- Able to change speed and direction.
- Taking part in a relay, remembering when to run and what to do.





EXPRESSIVE ART AND DESIGN

Your child will be:

- Designing a 3D map of Europe.
- Learning how to sculpt a 3D object using play dough and other materials.
- Creating a 3D maps using modroc including the different topographical features, such as valleys, rivers, hills etc.
- Using weaving to create European flags.



EXTRA ACTIVITIES/ THINGS TO BRING IN

- Old newspapers
- Examples of traditional tales from different countries.
- Photos from your home country or your travels in the UK or Europe.
- Traditional objects or dress that are typical of your country.
