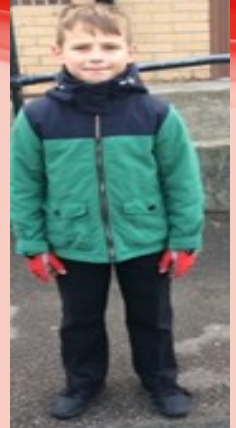

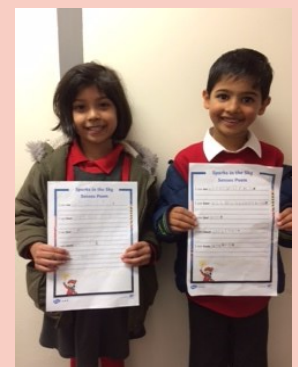
They took part in workshops alongside other schools to get inspiration for creative and innovative ways to communicate the importance of being active to their peers and the wider school community.
